May 3rd OCRACES Meeting

Our May meeting will start at 1930 hours at 840 N. Eckhoff Street in Orange. The primary focus of this meeting will be reviewing the new OCRACES vehicle S.O.P. and providing hands-on training for OCRACES personnel on the set-up and use of the vehicle.

County Volunteer Recognition Ceremony

The OCRACES vehicle committee was honored April 21st by the County Board of Supervisors. They were one of two groups and 52 individuals who were recognized by the Board at the eighth annual Countywide volunteer recognition ceremony.

More than 26,000 volunteers donated 942,097 hours of service valued at approximately \$24 million in avoided costs for County government in 2003.

"Our valued volunteers have many different backgrounds, interests, careers and reasons for volunteering," said CEO James Ruth. "Because of this diversity, they bring an array of experience and ex-

pertise to their roles and enhance our existing services and programs. I commend them all for their generosity and dedication."



The ceremony was held in the Board hearing room of the Hall of Administration. Certificates were presented during the awards ceremony. Congratulations to our RACES volunteers for the great job on our emergency communications response vehicle!

May also promises to be busy, with some remaining work to be accomplished on the RACES Vehicle; OCRACES Vehicle Familiarization Training at the May 3 OCRACES meeting (don't miss this one!); the Anaheim RACES SET Exercise on May 8 (a simulated 6.5 magnitude earthquake), and the County of Orange Health Care Agency EMS Week celebration at Angel's Stadium on May 22. OCRACES plans to rollout it's new OCRACES Emergency Communications Vehicle for these exercises.

OCRACES now has a dedicated computer and printer that was recently installed in the Loma Ridge RACES room. This computer has access to the Internet and county e-mail. This will be a valuable tool for use in communicating between agencies during an exercise or actual emergency, while also providing important information such as realtime weather and news updates. Thanks to Harvey Packard, KM6BV for specifying the hardware and operating systems, and Robert Stoffel, KD6DAQ for arranging the purchase and installation of this equipment.

On May 8th, 2004 a magnitude 6.6 magnitude earthquake will cause the City of Anaheim to open it's Emergency Operations Center and, with the help of communications volunteers, deal with the many issues that unfold during the morning.

But Anaheim RACES Ok, it's only a test. SET2004, a Simulated Emergency Test, will be supported by the County of Orange and several local area RACES groups and the Hospital Disaster Support Communications System. SET2004 is an exercise designed to increase cooperation among all RACES groups in the north Orange County area, while maximizing involvement as it slowly increases everyone's stress level.

The "almost complete" final draft of the Master Sequence of Events List (MSEL) was distributed to all Chief Radio Officers of those groups who had previously expressed interest. There's still time to "join in the festivities" and become part of SET2004 during a massive mobilization of local area volunteer communications resources. County of Orange RACES History

The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) was created in the early 1950's by the Federal government. On December 1, 1953, by resolution of the Orange County Board of Supervisors, the Orange County Communicators Club was authorized to become part of the Orange **County** Civil Defense. For the next 30 years, the **RACES** organization in Orange County was a group of Amateur Radio communicators that supported not only Orange County but also cities in the County during a time of emergency. In the mid-1980s, the cities in Orange County realized the benefits of Amateur Radio and began to form their own **RACES** organizations. Today, County of Orange **RACES** is recognized as one of the leading **RACES** organizations in the state. Our **RACES** program is administered by **CCSD** Communications under the leadership of Emer-

gency Communications Coordinator Robert Stoffel, KD6DAQ, and Chief Radio Officer Ray Grimes, N8RG. Our volunteers provide disaster, emergency and special event communications support to Orange County Fublic Safety agencies, and meet monthly for training and special activities. **RACES** supports the County by using various modes of Amateur Radio communications including voice, Morse Code, amateur satellite, amateur television, slow-scan television and various digital modes. County of Orange **RACES** has a dedicated radio room at the Operational Area Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and an emergency response communications vehicle that provides both Amateur Radio and Fublic Safety communications support at any emergency, disaster or special event location.
